When you give as unto the Lord and receive as unto the Lord, you will find giving and receiving of gifts more fulfilling.

- Acts 20:35 (KJV) says, '...remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, It is more blessed to give than to receive.'
- Notice what Matthew 6:1-4 (AMP) says, '1 TAKE CARE not to do your good deeds publicly or before men, in order to be seen by them; otherwise you will have no reward [reserved for and awaiting you] with and from your Father Who is in heaven. ² Thus, whenever you give to the poor, do not blow a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites in the synagogues and in the streets like to do, that they may be recognized and honored and praised by men. Truly I tell you, they have their reward in full already. ³ But when you give to charity, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴ So that your deeds of charity may be in secret; and your Father Who sees in secret will reward you openly.'
